THE GENERATIONS FILMMAKER WORKSHOP 2009

What is it?

A **FREE** eight-week **intergenerational workshop** working with other Bay Area Youth and Elders to **write, script, cast, storyboard, shoot, and edit a collaborative short film that will screen at the 33rd San Francisco International LGBT Film Festival June 18-28, 2009.** Through hands-on exercises, you will learn how to make a movie from beginning to end – from using a digital video camera to directing actors to editing your footage. You will also get a stipend for your full participation.

Who is it for?

Bay Area Youth and Elders who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning or queer and are **interested in participating in an intergenerational collaboration.** *No prior video experience is necessary to participate.* Young women and people of color are encouraged to apply.

When is it?

Workshops run **February 21-April 11, 2009.** Class is held on five consecutive Saturdays from 1-4 pm and on five, full weekend days from 10am - 6pm. There will be additional times required for editing and homework outside of class. *You must be able to attend all classes to participate.*

Class dates: 2/21, 2/28, 3/7, 3/14, 3/21, 3/28, 3/29, 4/4, 4/5, 4/11

Where is it?

Workshops will take place at **Ninth Street Independent Film Center**, 145 Ninth Street #101, San Francisco, CA 94103 (between Mission & Howard). Near bus lines: 14 Mission, 26 Valencia, 19 Polk, 21 Hayes, F Market. BART: Civic Center.

What else do I get?

You will receive a stipend and a **DVD copy of your movie** for your full participation in the project. You will also receive a **guest filmmaker pass** to attend all screenings and events at the 33rd San Francisco International LGBT Film Festival June 18-28, 2009, where **your film will also be screened!** In addition, you will receive a list of **resources to further your filmmaking practice.**

Fill out the application completely and submit it by mail, email or in person **by Monday, February 9, 2009.** We will notify you by Friday, February 13, 2009.
